#### FEBRUARY 15, 2011 SPECIAL STATE SENATE DISTRICT ELECTIONS SEMI-FINAL RESULTS REPORTED

Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean Logan announced semi-final election results for the February 15, 2011 Special State Senate District Elections with 100% of the precincts reporting, 10.95% of eligible registered voters cast ballots in the 17th and 28th State Senate Districts.

A total of 87,812 ballots were processed and counted on Election Night. This included 52,386 Vote by Mail ballots and 35,426 polling place ballots cast at the 597 voting precincts throughout the 17th and 28th State Senate Districts.

The official election canvass will take place beginning Thursday, February 17, 2011 through Friday, February 25, 2011. Supplemental election result updates throughout the canvass period may be accessed via the RR/CC website [www.lavote.net](http://www.lavote.net). The first supplemental results update will be posted Friday, February 18 after 5:00 p.m. Additional updates will be posted Tuesday, February 22, 2011 and Friday, February 25, 2011, with the final official election results certified on Monday, February 28, 2011.
