### **THOUSANDS OF VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS RECEIVED AND PROCESSED LAST THREE DAYS OF IN-PERSON EARLY VOTING *Voters may cast ballots for Nov. 2, 2010 General Election this weekend***

Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean Logan reported today that a record number of Vote By Mail ballots have been issued for the November 2nd General Election. This election more than one million Vote By Mail ballots were issued, a record number surpassing the total issued for the November 2008 Presidential Election. As of October 28, 2010 approximately 400,000 Vote By Mail envelopes have been returned.

This weekend In-Person Early Voting will be available at RR/CC Headquarters in Norwalk (12400 Imperial Highway, Norwalk, CA 90650). To accommodate voters, hours of operation have been extended this weekend. "In an effort to assist voters, especially those who are dealing with hectic schedules, we wanted to provide them every opportunity to be able to cast their ballot in the General Election. The ability to vote on the weekend provides voters an added opportunity to cast their ballot other than on Election Day," said Logan.

To vote early, voters can visit the 3rd floor of the RR/CC Headquarters located at 12400 Imperial Hwy., Norwalk, CA, through November 2. In-person Early Voting will be available this weekend October 30-31 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and on Monday, November 1, during regular office hours 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Logan also reported that on October 4, the RR/CC began processing Vote By Mail ballot requests from voters wishing to cast a ballot by mail for the November 2 Election. "To date, over 1,105,381 voters have been issued Vote By Mail ballots, and over 401,269 have returned their voted ballot by mail or in-person to the RR/CC," stated Logan.

Voters who request a Vote By Mail ballot can check the status of their request using the RR/CC's online look-up. Visit [www.lavote.net](http://www.lavote.net) and click on the *Voting and Elections* button located on the main page and then click the *Request and Track Vote By Mail Ballot* button on the *Voting and Elections* page. Voters may also call the RR/CC at (562) 466-1323.

In order to be counted, ballots cast by mail must be returned with sufficient time for mail delivery to the RR/CC by 8 p.m. on November 2, 2010 (postmarked ballots will not be counted). Vote By Mail ballots may also be returned in person to the RR/CC Headquarters, or delivered to any polling place in Los Angeles County before the polls close at 8 p.m. on Election Day. A voter may authorize a designated family member to return the voted ballot to a polling place or to the RR/CC in accordance with the procedures outlined on the Vote By Mail ballot return envelope.
