“WHAT VOTERS NEED TO KNOW”

Nearly 2 Million Los Angeles County Voters Prepare to Cast Ballots

Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk (RR/CC) Dean Logan encourages Los Angeles County voters to cast their vote on Tuesday, November 8, 2011 in the Local & Municipal Consolidated Elections. “Your vote makes a difference in the communities in which you live. Voters will have an opportunity to elect local representatives to city office, school board and special district seats,” said Logan. Nearly 1.6 million voters will have an opportunity to vote in this Tuesday’s election.

Contests to appear on the ballot include 19 cities, 42 unified and elementary school districts, 4 high school districts, 6 community college districts, 4 water districts, 6 county water districts, 8 city measures and 3 school district measures. The number of offices to be elected is 195.

To assist voters, the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk has prepared a “What Voters Need to Know” fact sheet (see attachment).

WHAT VOTERS NEED TO KNOW

1 Find Your Polling Place

- Review the back cover of your Official Sample Ballot booklet;
- Visit the RR/CC website at www.lavote.net to look up your polling place
- Call the RR/CC at (800) 815-2666-Option "1."

2 Polling Place Hours

On Election Day, Tuesday, November 8 polling places will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

3 Look Up Your Sample Ballot Online

Visit the RR/CC website at www.lavote.net to look up your polling place.

4 Return Your Vote By Mail (VBM) Ballot

- If you have not mailed back your voted VBM ballot, you can return it at any polling place location participating in the Local & Municipal Consolidated Elections between 7 a.m. - 8 p.m. on Election Day.
- Place your voted ballot in the purple VBM envelope, seal it, and sign it.
- VBM voters who may have lost/damaged their ballot may cast a provisional ballot at their polling place.

5 Track Your Vote By Mail Ballot

- Voters can track the status of their Vote By Mail ballot at www.lavote.net.

6 Vote On Saturday Or Sunday

- RR/CC Headquarters will have extended hours this weekend for early Voting; Saturday, November 5th and Sunday, November 6th, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The office is located at 12400 Imperial Hwy., Norwalk, CA 90650.

7 Language Assistance

In compliance with federal and state law, the RR/CC provides assistance in six languages other than English (Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Spanish, Tagalog/Filipino and Vietnamese).

- In polling places with sufficient need for language assistance, there will be bilingual poll workers available to assist voters and translated election materials (including sample ballots, voter notices and Voter Bill of Rights).

8 Services For Voters With Disabilities

- The RR/CC provides a range of assistive services for voters with disabilities; including accessible election materials, wheel chair accessible polling places and assistive voting devices to ensure a positive and independent voting experience.
- Curbside voting is available at poll locations without wheelchair accessibility.
