KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

Voter Bill of Rights

- You have the right to cast a ballot if you are a valid registered voter. A valid registered voter means a United States citizen who is a resident in this state, who is at least 18 years of age and not in prison or on parole for conviction of a felony, and who is registered to vote at his or her current residence address.
- You have the right to cast a provisional ballot if your name is not listed on the voting rolls.
- You have the right to cast a ballot if you are present and in line at the polling place prior to the close of
- You have the right to cast a secret ballot free from intimidation.
- You have the right to receive a new ballot if, prior to casting your ballot, you believe you made a mistake. If at any time before you finally cast your ballot, you feel you have made a mistake, you have the right to exchange the spoiled ballot for a new ballot. Vote-By-Mail voters may also request and receive a new ballot if they return their spoiled ballot to an election official prior to the closing of the polls on election
- You have the right to receive assistance in casting your ballot, if you are unable to vote without assis-
- You have the right to return a completed Vote-By-Mail ballot to any precinct in the county.
- You have the right to election materials in another language, if there are sufficient residents in your precinct to warrant production.
- You have the right to ask questions about election procedures and observe the election process. You have the right to ask questions of the precinct board and election officials regarding election procedures and to receive an answer or be directed to the appropriate official for an answer. However, if persistent questioning disrupts the execution of their duties, the board or election officials may discontinue responding to questions.
- You have the right to report any illegal or fraudulant activity to a local election official or to the Secretary of State's Office.

REGISTER TO VOTE

WHO CAN REGISTER TO VOTE?

- United States citizen
- At least 18 years of age at the time of the next election.
- Not in prison or on parole for a felony conviction.
- A current resident of California

WHEN SHOULD YOU REGISTER OR RE-REGISTER TO VOTE?

NOTE: If you are already registered you do not need to register to vote for every election.

- The deadline to register to vote is 15 days before the election.
- You must re-register every time you have a change of address.
- You must re-register if you change your name
- You must re-register to change political party affiliation.

HOW TO REGISTER TO VOTE?

To become a registered voter in California you must complete a Voter Registration Form and mail or deliver it in person to the Registrar's office. To obtain a form:

- Visit www.lavote.net and click the "Register to Vote" button.
- Visit any of our RR/CC district offices.
- Pick up a form at most County, State and Federal government agencies, your Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), Public Assistance agencies (DPSS), (WIC), or a local Post Office.

HOW DO I KNOW IF I AM REGISTERED TO VOTE?

- If you receive your official Sample Ballot Booklet.

WHAT'S IN YOUR SAMPLE BALLOT?

Before each election, official sample ballot booklets containing candidate and measure information are sent to all registered voters to assist them in making informed voting choices.

Mark your sample ballot booklet and take it to your poll location to use as a reference guide on Election Day

VOTE-BY-MAIL (VBM)

Any registered voter in California may request to vote-by-mail in a single election; or in every election as a **Permanent Vote-By-Mail Voter (PVBM).**

HOW DO I REQUEST A VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT?

- Submit a request online at www.lavote.net by clicking on the "Vote-By-Mail" button.
- Complete and mail back the request form on the back of your Sample Ballot.
- Download a request form in "pdf" online at www.lavote.net
- Submit a request in writing that includes: full name, home address, signature and address where ballot should be mailed. Mail to:

HOW DO I BECOME A PVBM?

- Download and complete a Permanent Voteby-Mail application at www.lavote.net
- You can request PVBM status on your Voter Registration form.

WHEN CAN I REQUEST A VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT?

 Starting 29 days before an election and no later than 7 days before the election.

HOW DO I RETURN MY VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT?

- Voted ballots must be mailed and arrive at the Registrar of Voters office before 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. Late ballots will not be counted.
- Deliver your voted ballot at any polling place in Los Angeles County on Election Day.


