
Inka Vote Device (Vote Recorder)



- Not declared mentally incompetent by a court



Voting Rights Act . . .

The Federal Voting Rights Act requires that voting assistance be provided to voters who need assistance in a targeted language or who reside in an area with a high concentration of multilingual voters. Voters with limited proficiency in English can enhance their understanding and participation in the voting process through the multilingual program. Our department works with community groups through its Community Voter Outreach Committee to receive feedback on these services.

VOTER SERVICES FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES



California law permits registered voters, including those with disabilities, to apply for permanent Vote By Mail (VBM) status.

For information regarding the permanent VBM program, please call (562) 466-1323.

Whenever possible, the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk recruits voting locations accessible to persons with disabilities. However, if your polling location is not accessible, you may vote your ballot outside the poll location or at a nearby accessible location.

Cassette tape recordings of the information printed in sample ballot bookdets for state and county measures are available for visually impaired voiers. The tapes are available approximately three weeks before an election and from the Registra-Recorder/County Clerk, Election Information Section, call (552) 456-1310. They are also available at city and county libraries and at the Braille Institute in Los Anoeles.

The Registrar-Recorder/ County Clerk needs Pollworkers and Polling Locations:



<u>Pollworkers</u>: We always need civic-minded citizens to serve as pollworkers on election day. Pollworkers receive \$80 to \$100 plus \$25 to attend a training session.

<u>Polling locations:</u> Volunteer your location as a polling place and receive \$25. We especially need locations that are accessible to persons with disabilities.

Who can be a Pollworker?

Eligibility requirements

- Registered voter, California resident and United States citizen
- 18 years of age or older
- Students must be 16 years old, nominated by their school and enrolled in official student pollworker program, also needs to be a senior with a 2.5 minimum GPA.

Pollworker Considerations

Pollworker Pay

- •Clerks receive \$105.00 stipend.
 This includes training class bonus of *\$25.
- •Inspectors receive up to *\$175.00 stipend.
 This includes training bonus & pick-up of election supplies

* Must Attend Training
