## **DODGERS AND COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES REGISTRAR-RECORDER AND COUNTY CLERK PARTNER TO OFFER NEW VOTER REGISTRATION AND EDUCATION SERVICES AT DODGER STADIUM**

LOS ANGELES – The Los Angeles Dodgers and Los Angeles County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk Dean Logan today announced that they will partner to offer voter registration and education information to eligible voters in Los Angeles County in time for the upcoming November 4 Presidential General Election. Voter registration forms will be available at every home game at Registrar-Recorder booths at Dodger Stadium located on the Reserve and Loge Levels beginning this homestand and continuing through September 25.

“We are excited about our partnership with the Dodgers in bringing all Los Angeles County eligible voters services they need to register and vote not only in the upcoming Presidential Election but in all future elections,” said Logan.

Los Angeles County serves all voters including those with specific needs. Polling places are equipped with audio ballot booths that provide audio translation of ballots, election materials are available in seven languages, and there are other assistive services for voters with disabilities and limited English proficiency. Dodger fans can also become a vital part of the democratic process by signing up to work as poll workers or student election workers.

The Dodgers and the Los Angeles County Registrar Recorder/County Clerk encourage all eligible residents to register to vote before the October 20, 2008 close of registration deadline so they can cast a vote in the upcoming November 4 Presidential General Election.
