- You are expected to serve the ENTIRE day from 6 am to 9:30 pm! Please do not schedule any events on Election Day.
- Arrange transportation to and from the polling place ahead of time.
- Dress appropriately and comfortably (no attire with political affiliations).
- Bring snacks and beverages to last throughout the day.
Please note: Meals are not provided.
- You will receive your stipend 4 - 6 weeks after Election Day.

What is the Student Pollworker Program?

The Los Angeles County Student Pollworker Program provides high school students with an exciting opportunity to serve as pollworkers on Election Day!

Responsibilities include:

- Setting up/opening polling place
- Assisting voters
- Closing the polling place
- Counting ballots

Who Can Apply?

- U.S. Citizens 16 years or older
- Legal Permanent Resident (Green Card Holder) 18 years or older
- Good academic standing: G.P.A. of 2.5 or greater
- Must have teacher and parental consent
