(E. C. §§ 13307 & 11327) OFFICER'S STATEMENT During this period, each officer sought to be recalled may file a candidate statement not to exceed 200 words for inclusion with the Official Sample Ballot Booklet. SEP. 11 (Th) E-89		NOTICE OF ELECTION — PUBLICATION Recommended date to publish a notice of election. A general press release providing information on the elective offices and the telephone number to call regarding candidate nomination procedures shall also be issued. (E.C. §§ 12101 & 12102)

SEP. 12 (F) E-88	CONSOLIDATION OF ELECTIONS Last day for City Clerk to file a resolution with the Board of Supervisors and Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk requesting consolidation with the recall election. A resolution placing a measure on the ballot shall contain the ballot wording which cannot exceed 75 words. (E.C. §§ 13247, 10402 & 10403)
SEP. 17 (W) E-83	AMENDMENT OR WITHDRAWAL OF MEASURE – DEADLINE Last day for Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk to receive a resolution from the City Council requesting to withdraw or amend any measure previously submitted for placement on the ballot. (E.C. § 9605)
SEP. 19 (F) E-81	DATE FIXED TO SUBMIT ARGUMENTS – PUBLICATION Not later than this date a notice shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation in the city, setting forth the date fixed for submitting arguments for or against a measure. (E. C. §§ 9286, 12111 & Govt. Code § 6061)
SEP. 22 (M) E-78	ARGUMENTS – LAST DAY TO SUBMIT Last day to submit arguments for or against any measure. Arguments may not exceed 300 words in length. (E.C. §§ 9282 & 9286) IMPARTIAL ANALYSIS – LAST DAY TO SUBMIT Recommended last day for City Attorney to transmit impartial analysis of any measure. (E. C. § 9282) MEASURE ENCLOSURES Not later than this date, the City shall deliver a copy of ordinance text and any other ballot material to the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk requesting inclusion in the Official Sample Ballot Booklet.

Recommended period for the City Clerk to make available for public examination, a copy of **ballot measure text, impartial analysis and arguments for a measure**. A fee may be charged to any candidate/person obtaining a copy of the materials. During this period any person may file a writ of mandate or an injunction to require any or all of the data/material to be amended or deleted.

MEASURE ENCLOSURES

No later than **September 23, 2008**, the City Clerk shall deliver a copy of each argument, ordinance text, analysis and any other ballot data/material to the County Elections Official for inclusion in the Official Sample Ballot Booklet.

SEP. 26 (F) E-74	OCT 6* (M) E-64*	PUBLIC EXAMINATION PERIOD FOR CANDIDATE AND/OR OFFICER'S STATEMENTS, CANDIDATES NAMES AND BALLOT DESIGNATIONS During this period, candidate and officer's statements, candidates names, and ballot designations shall be open for public examination. A fee may be charged to any person obtaining a copy of material. During this period any person may file a writ of mandate or an injunction to require any or all of the data/material to be amended or deleted. (E. C. § 13313)
SEP. 26 (F) E-74		RANDOMIZED ALPHABET DRAWING BY SECRETARY OF STATE The Secretary of State shall hold a public drawing to determine order of candidates name on ballot by randomly drawing each letter of the alphabet. (E.C. § 13113)
OCT. 2 (Th) E-68		REBUTTALS – LAST DAY TO SUBMIT Last day for authors of arguments for or against a measure to submit rebuttals. Rebuttals may not exceed 250 words in length. (E.C. § 9285)
OCT. 3 (F) E-67	OCT. 13 (M) E-57	PUBLIC EXAMINATION PERIOD FOR REBUTTALS During this period, rebuttals shall be available for public examination. A fee may be charged to any person obtaining a copy of the material. During this period any person may file a writ of mandate or an injunction to require any or all of the material/data to be amended or deleted. (E.C. § 9295)

NOV. 10 (M) E-29	DEC. 2 (Tu) E-7	VOTE BY MAIL — FIRST AND LAST DAY TO APPLY Between these dates (both dates inclusive) applications may be filed. Applications received prior to the 29th day preceding the election will be kept and processed during this period. (E. C. §§ 3001 & 3003)
NOV. 24 (M) E-15		REGISTRATION CLOSSES Last day to transfer or register to vote in the election. (E. C. §§ 2102 & 2107)
NOV. 25 (Tu) E-14		STATEMENT OF WRITE-IN CANDIDACY — DEADLINE Last day for a candidate to file a Statement of Write-in Candidacy and sponsors' signatures, if applicable, that he or she is a Write-in Candidate for the election. (E. C. §§ 8600 & 8601) BILINGUAL PRECINCT OFFICER LIST Last day to prepare list of appointed bilingual precinct officers. (E. C. § 12303) NOTICE OF LIST OF NOMINEES — PUBLICATION On or before this date, a notice of list of nominees shall be published once each week for two successive weeks prior to the election in a newspaper of general circulation published in the city. (E. C. § 12110 & Govt. Code § 6066)

This registration must be executed in the office of the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk. A new resident shall vote a new resident's ballot in that office.</p> <p>(E. C. §§ 331 & 3500-3503)</p>
DEC. 1* (M) E-8*		<p>TALLY CENTER LOCATION — PUBLICATION</p> <p>On or before this date a notice specifying the public place to be used as the central tally center for counting the ballots shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation within the city.</p> <p>(E. C. § 12109)</p> <p>MAIL OFFICIAL SAMPLE BALLOT BOOKLETS</p> <p>An Official Sample Ballot Booklet shall be mailed to each voter in the city not less than 8* days preceding the election.</p> <p>(E. C. § 11324)</p>
DEC. 2 (Tu) E-7		<p>CANVASS VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS</p> <p>The canvass may commence on the 7th day before the election, but the results of the tally shall not be released until after the polls close.</p> <p>(E. C. § 15101)</p> <p>POLLING PLACES — PUBLICATION</p> <p>Not later than this date, a list of polling places for each precinct shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation within the city.</p> <p>(C. §§ 12105, 12106 & Govt. Code § 6061)</p>
DEC. 3 (W) E-6	DEC. 9 (Tu) ELECTION DAY	<p>EMERGENCY VOTE BY MAIL</p> <p>Between these dates, any voter may apply for a Vote By Mail Ballot if conditions require his or her absence from the precinct on election day. The voter may designate an authorized representative to pick-up and return the ballot.</p> <p>(E. C. §§ 3021 & 3110)</p>

<p>DEC. 9 (Tu) 8 P.M. ELECTION DAY</p>	<p>ELECTION DAY Polls open 7 a.m., close 8 p.m. (E. C. § 14212)</p> <p>VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS RETURNED — 8 P.M. Last day for Vote By Mail Ballots to be received or turned in personally by the voter at any polling place in the jurisdiction. A designated family member may return the voted ballot under specified conditions. (E. C. §§ 3017 & 3020)</p> <p>DEFACING OF UNUSED BALLOTS At 8 p.m., immediately after polls close, commence defacing or sealing all unused ballots and file an affidavit of the number of ballots destroyed or sealed. (E. C. §§ 14403 & 14404)</p>
<p>DEC. 10 (W) E+1</p>	<p>CANVASS OF ELECTION RETURNS The canvass of returns shall commence no later than the first Thursday following the election. (E. C. § 15301)</p>
<p>DEC. 19 (F) E+10</p>	<p>COMPLETION OF OFFICIAL CANVASS The Canvass shall be completed by the elections official no later than the fourth Friday after the election. Upon completion of the Canvass, the elections official shall certify the results to the Board of Supervisors. (E. C. § 10262)</p> <p>NOTE: On Friday, December 19, 2008 the Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk is tentatively scheduled to certify the election results. On Tuesday, December 23, 2008, the Board of Supervisors is tentatively scheduled to declare the election results official. If recall(s) prevails, the Maywood City Council shall install the newly elected officers.</p>
